			The core knowledge and skills required for ACCA members to work as accountants – in practice, commerce or the public and not-for-profit sectors – are consistent throughout the world. ACCA students are examined to a single international standard, regardless of where they live or study. Exams were held in 139 countries in 2006. Syllabus content varies only with essential regard to national legislation and taxation provision.  The new ACCA Qualification has been developed following global consultation with some 30,000 members, students and influencers in the profession, who were asked for their views on the skills and competences required of 21st century accountants.  In response to the consultation, ACCA is introducing its new qualification with an enhanced emphasis on professionalism and ethics.
